Dear Friends

No sooner is the celebration of Christmas past when a New Year beckons with all its challenges and opportunities. This is the time of year, when the minds of Ministers, Session Clerks and Treasurers turn towards the Stated Annual Meeting and the preparation of the annual accounts. It is a time when people in church offices are updating lists and getting ready for the production of newsletters. It is a time when thoughts turn towards Lent, Holy Week and Easter.

In the past number of weeks, a great deal of thought and planning has been done to provide continuity during a time of transition. In November of last year, our Church Officer retired. Among his various duties, he was responsible for opening and closing the halls for organisations, setting out tables and chairs for different events and keeping the church and halls clean and tidy. I want to personally thank everyone who has rallied round to ensure that these functions are still fulfilled and especially those who have co-ordinated this since November. The new arrangement will help us make a financial saving. It is important because the loss of the income from the Industrial Tribunal Service caused us to run with a significant and unsustainable deficit.

A similar amount of time, effort and thought has gone into planning for the Café and Outreach Enterprise. Again, for financial reasons, it is no longer possible to have a paid Café and Outreach Co-ordinator. Tasks have been shared and responsibilities assumed by individuals who have enabled us to continue the outreach meals with minimal disruption. Adjustments have been made to make the system more efficient and this could not have been done without the skillset of dedicated individuals who gave up hours of valuable time over the Christmas and New Year period.

With the reduction of two posts, significant savings will be made but costs beyond our control are still rising and we will continue to require the sacrificial giving of our members throughout the year. Please give this matter your consideration when you are reviewing your givings. It is pleasing to report that in the next few months, a beautiful stained glass window will be added to our church in memory of the Goodfellow sisters, whose generosity to Pathhead will never be forgotten. May we all be inspired by their example of faith, disicipleship and stewardship.

## Kirkcaldy Foodbank

Helping people in crisis in the Kirkcaldy area



It is the mission of Kirkcaldy Foodbank that nobody in the Kirkcaldy area goes hungry during a time of crisis and that everybody shares what they have.

We are an independent foodbank working hard to ensure local people do not go hungry during a time of crisis since our launch in December 2013. At Kirkcaldy Foodbank we work towards helping local people and families in crisis by providing emergency food parcels to people in need. We exist to:

- work towards relieving poverty and hardship in the Kirkcaldy area,
- support local people and their families to find longer-term solutions, through advice and guidance,
- work towards a more equitable society by promoting sharing in the local area,
- promote dignity and respect within the local community, and
- work in partnership with other organisations to alleviate poverty and social exclusion within the Kirkcaldy area.

In order to operate, the Foodbank requires regular donations of food. We at Pathhead want to support the Foodbank and so we have set up a shopping trolley within the large hall where donations can be left. ## Treasurer's Report

Our income has decreased by several thousand pounds. This has dropped due to the decrease from the use of premises (due to the loss of the Tribunal Service), the decrease in gift aid and the decrease in Pathhead Christian Outreach income.

We need to strive to increase our income even more over the next year. The Church's expenditure is up on last year by some £3,600 despite our endeavours to keep it down. Most of other expenditures are down slightly due good housekeeping. We are trying to manage without a caretaker thus saving a wage. We should hope to see the benefit of this gradually appear throughout the year. Pathhead Christian Outreach finances should improve as the administrator has not been replaced making another saving in wages. That is why every effort is being made to make the system work over the three month trial period so everyone's co-operation is essential. The outreach meals are a very important service to the community so we need it to work.
