Dear Friends

Another busy term has come and gone. A successful Summer Fair brought many into our church halls to share in a most happy day, the 200 Group are beavering away with plans to celebrate our bi-centenary, the work and witness of the Kirk continues through these challenging days and our services continue to be live-steamed and posted onto YouTube as a resource for anyone who cannot be physically present in church on a Sunday morning, or for anyone who wishes to catch-up on services they may have missed.

For these past number of weeks we have been blest to have Gayle Lennon with us. Gayle has been undertaking the enquiry process which helps individuals to discern their particular call into ministry. My role is to be her mentor for a period of three to six months and it has already been a delight and a pleasure to see Gayle on Sundays along with her family and to show her some of the aspects of ministry within the life of our own congregation. Gayle and her family are heavily involved in church life at Cupar and Gayle's daughter Rebekah is musically gifted, using this talent in Christian witness and outreach. She submitted an article to the March edition of Life & Work and it was so well received that it was commented upon later in the June edition. Personally, I find this most encouraging and a reminder that, even today, individuals hear the call of Christ and gladly respond. Further encouragement comes from the Kingdom Park initiative, reaching out in Christ's Name to the new homes in that area of the town. An advert has now been submitted for a Pioneer Worker to take up the challenge of mission in close co-operation with all the denominations and churches within the area. Interviews are scheduled before the end of June.

My work as Interim Moderator at St Bryce Kirk continues but I am pleased to report that Probationer Minister, Trudy Newton is due to be ordained in August and prior to that, she will take up post, being responsible for Sunday services and pastoral duties. This will greatly assist me in ministering to that congregation while it shares the significant task of the union of the four town centre churches into one charge. The Reverend Stewart McPherson has been introduced as Interim Minister to those congregations and this too will significantly assist the process of union which involves many strands of congregational life being woven together.

So, a busy summer ahead and all the reason to find time for reflection, refreshment, relaxation and revitalization! May you have a most excellent summer.

The project aims to establish tree nurseries which will become self sustaining and will protect the environment.

Saturday Coffee Mornings




We are happy to let you all know that our Saturday Coffee Mornings will re-start in September. The coffee mornings will be held on the first Saturday of each month from 10 am

KART UPDATE



Kirkcaldy Area Reachout Trust have had another busy year. Our Youth Worker, Chris Beattie, has been working very hard to spread the Gospel to school age children in the Kirkcaldy Area. A programme called Walk Through the Bible has opened doors

and work in the schools has grown this school year. Walk Through the Bible classes have taken place in seven Fife Schools. In total KART have been in five local primary schools and one in Glenrothes. A total of 660 pupils have had the opportunity to go through the programme. Three new instructors have been trained since January, bringing the total number to 7.

Chris also hosted "Table Time" Sessions in Viewforth High in each term with about 100 pupils joining in and chatting each time. Hopefully something similar can get started in Balwearie High in the new school session.

KART assisted with the Easter Mission at Templehall & Torbain United Parish Church. The Adventure Cruise 'holiday club' took place in April with over 20 children attending over the three days. KART have also organised two Activity days (during School In-Service days) this year - 34 children registered at Newcraigs in November, with 33 registered for Torbain in February. Both explored stories from the Bible using crafts, games and other activities. Chris will also be helping with the Holiday Clubs being run by Newcraigs and Kinghorn & Burntisland Churches in the school summer holidays.

A group for 11-16 year olds has also been set up (called CONNECT) and has continued to meet. Activities have included a Chippy Crawl and a murder mystery night and there are plans for a visit to Laser Quest.

However, finance continues to be an issue. Fundraising events such as the Coffee Morning held at Pathhead in January have been really well supported and we raised £670 from that. The recent Sponsored Coastal Walk also raised another £1,483. But the Annual Report shows a potential deficit for the coming year of £7,020. Clearly this is not sustainable and the fantastic work KART is doing can only continue if funding is provided. Please consider if there is any way that you think you can support KART. The aim is to increase regular givers as this provides a sustained reliable source of income and if you feel you can afford to make a regular contribution that could make a real difference.

Finally, we have some vacancies to fill on the Management Committee. We are currently without a Chairperson or Secretary. Please pray that these important posts can be filled by the right people to enable KART to continue and grow.
